Most of these presentations are from 3-4 pages in your book so you may want to find additional images or resources to add to your presentation. Your presentation will be in the form of a multiple page .pdf file or a Power Point presentation, with a minimum of 6 slides or visuals. At the end of your presentation you are asked to show us 2 of your favorite fonts to the class and be prepared to talk about them a bit. The easiest way to do this it to just make your final slide in the presentation a sample of your fonts

**Objectives 3 points each:**

3	A minimum of 6 visuals. Including slides, illustrations, and/or graphic files (be creative).
3	Presentation is at least 10 minutes in length
3	Presentation is educational and informative in nature. It may also be entertaining and fun.
3	Checking for understandings sure that everyone is working alongside with you
3	Final slide has two examples of your favorite, (or least favorite) fonts to discuss in class. See below
